

Professor George Yeo

Professor George SH Yeo is the Chief of Obstetrics, Division of Obstetrics & Gynaecology at KK Women's & Children's Hospital. Professor Yeo is also the Director of the Antenatal Diagnostic Centre and Head, Maternal Fetal Medicine Department. He is an Adjunct Professor of Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore, as well as Professor of Duke-NUS Graduate Medical School.

Prof Yeo is instrumental in developing prenatal screening programmes in Singapore, set up and is responsible for the screening ultrasound programme in KK hospital, which delivers a third of Singapore's births. He is active in the teaching and training of obstetrics ultrasound related educational programmes in Singapore, organized the First International Scientific Meeting of ISUOG in 2004. He directs the programmes at the ISUOG Teaching and Training Centre in Singapore.



Professor Tan Kok Hian

Professor Tan is Head, Perinatal Audit & Epidemiology and Senior Consultant Maternal Fetal Medicine in KK Women's & Children's Hospital. Prof Tan is also Lead for Gestational Diabetes Mellitus (GDM), SingHealth Duke-NUS Diabetes Centre and the Lead Principal Investigator, NMRC Integrated Platform for Research in Advancing Metabolic Health Outcomes of Women and Children (IPRAMHO).

Prof Tan is President of Perinatal Society of Singapore and Past President of the Obstetrical & Gynaecological Society (OGSS) of Singapore. He is also Chairman of the Congress Trust Fund of OGSS.

Prof Tan initiated universal screening and the new IADPSG criteria in KKH and SGH since January 2016 based on a GUSTO cost effectiveness study of GDM screening, led by him. He is also Chairperson of College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists. Singapore GDM Committee 2017-2018 and also Chairperson, Expert Group GDM Appropriate Care Guide of The Agency for Care Effectiveness (ACE), Ministry of Health 2017-18.



Professor Jim Zhang

Professor Zhang graduated from Shanghai Medical University, Shanghai, China, in 1988 and obtained PhD degree in epidemiology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, U.S. in 1993. He was an Assistant Professor at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine, New York; and an Investigator and, then, a Senior Investigator at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) from 1997 to 2011. He was granted NIH tenure in 2005.

Prof Zhang served as a member of Advisory Boards of the NIH Reproductive Medicine Research Network and Neonatal Research Network, the World Health Organization (WHO) Consultant on Reproductive Health; received NIH Merit Award twice.

Currently, he is a K. C. Wong Chair Professor of Shanghai Jiao Tong University, and the Director of Ministry of Education – Shanghai Key Laboratory of Children's Environmental Health, Xinhua Hospital, Shanghai Jiao Tong University School of Medicine.



Professor Satvinder Singh Dhaliwal

Professor Dhaliwal is a Professor of Biostatistics within the School of Public Health, Curtin University. Professor Dhaliwal has been the funding recipient of 30 research grants and has a high impact publication record numbering over 170 journal papers.

Prof Dhaliwal has worked as a Statistician for the past 30 years and has accumulated extensive experience, both nationally and internationally, on the practical application of Statistics/Biostatistics in a wide variety of situations. He was previously employed with the Department of Endocrinology & Diabetes at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital as a Senior Scientist & Medical Statistician. Prof Dhaliwal's research interest includes the application of Biostatistics in the fields of Public Health Research and Clinical Research.

Associate Professor Tan is a senior consultant obstetrician and gynecologist. He has a special interest in maternal medicine, and currently runs the joint diabetic pregnancy clinic at the Singapore General Hospital, where he also oversees other collaborative joint pregnancy clinics in cardiology, hematology and rheumatology. He is the Vice Chair (Clinical) for the Singhealth OBGYN Academic Clinical Program, and also Associate Program Director for its OBGYN Residency Program. He is also the immediate Past President of the Singapore Obstetrical and Gynaecological Society of Singapore.



Dr Ann Wright

Dr Wright has been working as a Consultant in the MF Department of KKH since July 2014. She is involved in the daily running of Labour Ward and has an active role in high risk pregnancy management. She runs several clinics Antenatal clinics a week and forms part of the multi-disciplinary team looking after patients with medical disorders of pregnancy including diabetes and hypertension. She also cares for patients who have a complicated past obstetric history.

Dr Wright helped with the introduction of universal screening for gestational diabetes in Singapore using the IADPSG criteria which aims to ensure the best outcome for affected mothers in their current pregnancy and identifies women who are at risk of becoming diabetic in later life. This has the potential to delay the onset and perhaps even prevent the development of Type 2 diabetes through lifestyle modification which may have implications for healthcare provision in the country as a whole. She has also been one of the investigating team looking at HbA1C as an alternative screening tool for diabetes in early pregnancy.



Dr Shephali Tagore

Dr Shephali graduated in India (MBBS), obtained her initial postgraduate training and received doctorate degree (MD) in Obstetrics and Gynecology in 1994. Her subsequent Obstetrics & Gynecology training was in the UK in several hospitals. After MRCOG (2003), she joined the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology in KK Women's & Children's Hospital, Singapore, in 2004 and completed Advanced Specialty Training in 2008.
